



The Burden of Love

By this time last year our building was complete. We had a beautiful new gathering space with a building connecting our school with our church, physically connecting a ministry that has always been one. With two more classrooms, administrative space, meeting space for adult ministries the Lord provided much of what we had been physically lacking for today's ministry needs.

But we weren't satisfied with the appearance that things were happening at David's Star. We wanted to make use of the facilities to see that good kingdom work happens. So we began working at another building project. We called it "Building our Spiritual House". This project called on members who are strengthened regularly by the Holy Spirit through Word and Sacrament to befriend and encourage those who were staying away from these powerful tools of the Holy Spirit. Many went with a fresh zeal to personally and privately attempt to make a connection with another member, support and encourage them in their lives of faith. I often wonder how they are doing. The stories are untold because it is suppose to be that way. This is not elder work, that is, publically calling people to repentance. It's God's people loving God's people—one person encouraging another.

I know that it can often be burdensome, because that's what love is. "Carry each other's burdens and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2). We know that the law of Christ is to love God and love our neighbor. Such a definition of love doesn't often match with the world's definition. For many love is suppose to be fun, laughing, partying, comfortable, you know, free from conflict. People love me and make me happy. I love others and make them happy.

In contrast to that, consider God's love. "He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all..." (Romans 8:32). Does that sound like fun? "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me" (Matthew 26:38). Is Jesus laughing in the garden of Gethsemane? "And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him" (Mark 15:20). Is Jesus comfortable now as he carries his cross? "And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?'—which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mark 15:33). Free of conflict? Hardly. Jesus bore our burden as the supreme act of love. That's what love does.

Of course, that doesn't mean there is no joy in love. Jesus endured the cross and scorned its shame because of the joy that would result from it. The love of God results in deeper joy than we could ever know through worldly descriptions of love. It results in friendships based on full forgiveness and freedom rather than any personal benefit I might gain from a friendship. It results in restored relationships with God that ties us in a bond of fellowship for all eternity. The goal of love is eternal happiness that is indescribable.

So that we all may have that joy we need to pray for the same heart that God gave the apostle Paul, "Who is weak, and I do not feel weak? Who is led into sin, and I do not inwardly burn" (2 Corinthians 11:29)? In a month when the youth pray for Cupid's arrow to pierce the heart with passion, let us pray for the true God of love to fill our hearts with love that will bear the burdens of others. Pray for reconciliation with God and with one another. Pray for wisdom, strength and understanding to bear the burden of love.

David Martin is teaching an adult Bible class on Isaiah 40-66 for six straight weeks, starting on January 9th and concluding on February 13th. The study will focus on the Messianic prophets of Christ in Isaiah and how God kept the promise of the Savior alive in spite of the covenant breaking of the leaders and people of Judah, and their eventual exile into Babylon. The pastors will teach and alternate Bible study during these weeks. Prof. Pless will teach the teen Bible class, using John Brug's Revelation Bible study.



PIECE OF PIE

I recently had the opportunity to attend a workshop on how to create Bible studies so they work best for people. During one session a card cut out in the shape of a pie was handed out to each of us. Each piece of the pie had a letter written on it. The letters alone did not mean much, but the words that were printed on the back side of the pie explaining the letters on each piece of pie did mean something.

The presenter went on to explain that adults are typically self directed so let them decide what they want to learn. They are experienced, so therefore give them something to do; make it task orientated. Adults are problem solvers so let them determine how it will help them. And they want an immediate application, so what you do needs to pass the "who cares?" test.

Another of the sessions used the letters "APSBAT" to help us remember what we were learning. "All participants shall be able to..."

All of this was tied into a list of action verbs that we were to use when we wrote a Bible study. I am not writing a Bible study with this writing, but many of the things shared that day can and do apply to how we approach our planned giving and estate planning.

It is your decision to learn more about what planned giving is and whether you need it. Many of you likely have experienced the situation where someone did not have their estate planned when the Lord called them home. The task of planned giving can seem to be daunting. There are people who are able to help and be the problem solvers with you in seeing the importance of an estate plan. Those who love you are the ones who care that you have such a plan in place. Once your estate plan is in place, you, the participant, shall be able to have the comfort that you have provided for those you love when it is your time for the Lord to call you home.

Adoption of the 2011 Budget – The 2011 Budget was presented by Jim Korthals. Following discussion, a motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to pass the budget as presented.

Set non-member tuition for 2011-2012 – The Council recommended the following rates for the 2011-2012 school year for nonmembers: Preschool: \$1,350 per student, Kindergarten - \$2065 per student, Grade 1-8 - \$3600 for the first member in a family and \$3000 for each additional student from the same family.
