Jesus once told his disciples that one of the signs of the End Times was "wars and rumors of war." We certainly have both today. Does that mean the world in which we live will end soon? Maybe. Maybe not. Our loving Lord has chosen not to give us a specific timetable. However, during difficult times of turmoil he has not left us without hope and comfort. A motion was made and carried to accept all reports except those items that needed separate action under old or new business.

Old Business

Future of "Parish Center" – This is tabled until the next meeting.

Summer Charity Event – A fundraising event for June 25th is being planned to help the Washburn family with medical expenses for Barry. A medical need that was identified was a van to allow wheelchair accessibility. This event would be advertised only among our fellowship, and not to the general public. The event would be held from 1pm-5pm on this Saturday afternoon and would conclude with a worship service in the woods. Several members of music groups will perform. A silent auction will be held. There would be food and refreshments available. The Elders have given this plan their approval, and recommended to Council that this event be approved. This motion was approved by Council.

New Business

Tower Update – David Nunez is awaiting word from Bertram. Council discussed the possibility of giving Bertram a timeframe for finalizing the tower, and if this cannot be completed in the specified timeframe, we would terminate our relationship with Bertram and use A T & T for our internet needs.

Technology Committee – David Nunez brought up the reporting structure for this committee, as the committee presently reports to the Board for Buildings and Grounds. He felt we should consider having this committee report to someone else within Council, possibly the Vice President. David will report more information to Council members for further thought and consideration regarding this.

Built on the Rock Committee – The Council discussed the release of the existing committee, and the creation of a new committee by spring. The Council agreed that the Committee should be released at our April voters meeting. We will then work on a formation of a new committee.

Risograph purchase – It was reported that the risograph machine for the church is on its last leg, and will need to be replaced soon. Elder recommends replacing the machine with a \$5200-\$5300 printer. Council agreed to move forward with this plan, but it will need voters approval at the April meeting.

New Logo- There was discussion regarding a presentation by Dave Zarling from the Evangelism Committee regarding their proposal to update our logo. Dave distributed samples of a new logo to Council for their feedback. This items was tabled until the next Council meeting in order to give Council members a chance to review. Dave Zarling will send copies to absent Council members in order to give them an opportunity to provide their feedback, as well.

Undesignated gift designation – Per recommendation from the Stewardship Committee, we would replace the KML Foundation with Synodical Tuition Assistance in allocating funds received as an undesignated gift. Council approved

this item, and it will go to the voters for their approval in April.

Restricted Building Fund – Randy Matter made the following recommendation pertaining to our Restricted Building Fund:

Whereas, the David's Star voters received a final report on the costs of the building project in the January 2011 meeting, and

Whereas, the Restricted Building Fund has excess funds in it that are no longer for the recently completed building project, and

Whereas, it seems wise to use the excess funds in the Restricted Building Fund to pay down bank debt on the loan with Port Washington State Bank thereby reducing interest costs, and

Whereas, the following assets are on David's Star's current balance sheet and are designated on that balance sheet for use by the Restricted Building Fund: M & I Money Market – Thrivent \$57,107.97; M & I Savings - \$154,431.62; and Ziegler Money Market - \$40,828.26, and

Whereas, it seems wise to retain a reasonable cushion of funds in the Restricted Building Fund to allow for months when offerings do not cover the \$14,919.33 monthly payment required by the loan agreement, therefore

Be it resolved, that the Council authorize a Restricted Fund balance reserve amount of \$100,000 which equates to about 6 months of loan payments, and

Be it further resolved, that the Council authorize use of all assets on hand in excess of \$100,000 (approx. \$152,000) to be used to pay down debt on the recently completed building project, and

Be it further resolved, that the Council authorize use of any receipts going forward received by the Restricted Building Fund in excess of the \$100,000 reserve plus the required monthly payment of \$14,919.33 to be used to pay down the principal on the debt with Port Washington State Bank, and

Be it finally resolved, that should the reserve fall below \$100,000, no principal payments beyond the required monthly payment will be made on the loan until the reserve is restored to the \$100,000 level.

Council approved this recommendation, and this information will be reported to our voters at the April voters meeting.

National Eating Disorder Awareness Week

I recently have been spending time with a mother whose daughter is now in heaven because of an eating disorder. That families' story is heart breaking but the message that they wish to communicate as they grieve their loss is that this disease is preventable and certainly treatable in its early stages. I told that Mother that I would write about eating disorders this month in the newsletter with the goal of creating awareness and someday offering education in our schools to our adolescents

February 20th-26th is the **National Eating Disorder Awareness Week**. A good online resource for more information would be www.nationaleatingdisorders.org. More links to related sights are also listed. NEDA or the National Eating Disorder Association "is here to support the millions of families whose loved ones are battling eating disorders. We do it by offering the latest information, resources, and action-oriented advocacy. They also offer a sense of community to people feeling alone and overwhelmed in their struggle."

So...what is an eating disorder?

There are several kinds of eating disorder. The most common are **anorexia, bulimia, and binge eating disorder**. Eating disorders are not really about the food but a mental health disease that can include extreme emotions, attitudes, and behaviors that surround weight and food issues. Eating disorders can come from a variety of physical, emotional, and social issues, all of which need to be addressed for effective prevention and treatment. Eating disorders are real, complex, and devastating conditions that can have serious consequences for health, productivity, and relationships. Early recognition and treatment are very important. How about a few statistics about eating disorders?

- in the United States as many as **25 million** people are fighting a life and death battle with an eating disorder. Cardiac issues, hormonal problems, amenorrhea, damage to internal organs, anemia, and electrolyte imbalances are just a few of the problems seen.

- In a study of Division 1 NCAA athletes, over one-third of female athletes reported attitudes and symptoms placing them at risk for anorexia. Though most athletes with eating disorders are female, male athletes are also at risk — especially those competing in sports that tend to place an emphasis on the athlete's diet, appearance, size, and weight requirements.
- In any kind of mental health problem there is an average of a **ten-year** gap in treatment from the time the first signs and symptoms appear.
- Onset in adolescents normally manifests itself between the ages of 13-14 but can be as young as 9 or 10.

Being aware of the media's often narrow definition of beauty and acceptability can help protect a healthy self-esteem and body image. Our Lord made all of us different with a different bone structure, body size, and weight! **So listen to your body!** Eat what you want, when you are truly hungry and stop when you are full! God has a plan for us that is good!

CARING FOR YOUR FAMILY AND OTHERS WITH OUR GENEROUS SAVIOR'S GIFTS

Our generous God has given us all kinds of gifts. He has made us who we are, and in His wisdom put us here to live in this time and place. He has given us the priceless gifts of His Son and His Word and Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. He has made us His own dear members of His family now and forever.

SETTING GOALS

He also has given us money and property as blessings to use for ourselves and our families. This article looks at some of the basic ways we use God's blessings to bless our families and also those around us.

God has put us in families to bless us—to support ourselves and each other spiritually, emotionally and financially. Regardless of what form your family may take at the moment, our Savior seeks to make family a blessing for us.

One of the ways that we help provide for our families is with a will. A will is an act of love, in which you direct how you would like your blessings of money and property to be used after our Savior calls you home into the glory he prepared for you and has promised to you as your inheritance. A will accomplishes several things:

- It honors and shows love to our Savior, since He has given you everything to use to His glory in the many ways Christians use His gifts.
- It blesses and shows love to our families and friends as it seeks to give gifts to them.
- It honors and shows love for our Savior's Gospel, when some portion of the gifts He has given you is used so that people will continue to hear His Gospel, or perhaps hear it for the first time through your gift.
- It allows you to be the one who has the final say in how your money and property which our Savior has loaned you for a while will be used while you enjoy the glory of heaven.

Two thirds of Americans don't have a will. If you're past 18, you're an adult and you need a Power of Attorney for Health Care, and possibly a will. Even if you think you don't have much, you do have some blessings from God, and a will takes care of them. It is a gift to your family to have one, since it helps take care of things in a good, orderly way after our Savior calls you into His glory.

By now many of those New Year's Resolutions we set at the beginning of the year have been long forgotten. Such resolutions really don't have much chance of succeeding unless we plan how we intend to carry them out. The same is true for our lives as Christians. Under God we plan in order to reach goals.

As Christians, what is our ultimate goal? What did Jesus tell us in Matthew 6:33? "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." Certainly this is a great goal for us as Christians.

We're also told that goals should be detailed, specific, and measurable. How do we satisfy that criteria in light of our main goal to seek God's kingdom?

Remember that all we say and do and are should strain toward seeking God's kingdom. That means we'll be busy in the study of his Word and in regular attendance in church where we can hear his Word and receive his sacraments. It means that we'll be busy about his work of seeking and saving the lost. How is that accomplished?

The Apostle Paul wrote, "You show that you are a letter from Christ . . . written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts" (2 Corinthians 3:3). Jesus put it this way, "Let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16). This is what we are—God's letters who reflect the light of Jesus to a world trying to find its way in darkness.

The psalmist commanded, "Sing to the Lord, praise his name; proclaim his salvation day after day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples. For great is the Lord and most worthy of praise" (Psalm 96:2-4). In all our words, this should be our goal: to proclaim the goodness, the glory, the greatness of our God.

Then our acts should follow up our attitudes and words. Again Paul's words speak to us: "Bless those who persecute you . . . Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. Live in harmony . . . Do not repay anyone evil for evil. . . . If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone." (Romans 12:14-18). Throughout his letters, Paul urges us to share with those in need, to support those who preach and teach the Word, and to give as we have received.

These are worthy goals and ones we can only carry out by "the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, [who] though he was rich, yet for [our] sakes he became poor, so that [we] through his poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9).
