Shortly after this newsletter is published, our construction project will begin in earnest. Massive amounts of earth will be moved to create lowered entrances to our school. Normal access to the school building will be cut off. The parish center will no longer be accessible by driving between the church and school. It's going to be a mess. I'm reminded of a sign I've seen at many stores and public places attempting to conduct business during construction or a remodel: "Please excuse our mess."

We are willing to put up with the mess of construction because we look forward to the benefits the completed project will bring. We will have more space for gathering with our fellow Christians before and after worship. We will have more space for gospel ministry to adults. We will have better space for early childhood ministry. The project includes needed updates to the heating system and other hidden infrastructure items. It's a worthwhile project, but it will cause some short-term inconvenience for members and visitors alike. Please excuse our mess!

We can temporarily work around a messy construction site. But what about the mess we so often make of our lives by ignoring the word and will of God? How do we work around that? How do we take back that hurtful word that came out of our mouth like a poisoned dart aimed straight at someone we love? How can we repair the reputation of someone we

have slandered with our gossip? How can we feel right about singing God's praises in church when we know the awful condition of our heart?

"Please excuse our mess" might find its way to our lips as a personal prayer that ascends from our hearts to God's throne of grace. Yet, we know that the holy God will not turn a blind eye to our sin. His justice will not allow him to simply say, "That's OK! Try to do better next time." God does not tolerate imperfection in anyone. The law is clear. The wages of sin is death.

However, instead of ignoring our mess, our gracious God has cleaned it up for us. He sent his Son into our dirty sinful world to straighten out the chaos and clutter our sin caused. He sent Jesus to be our righteousness and perfection. When Jesus died on the cross, the power of sin to mess up our lives was destroyed. Through Spirit-worked faith we rise with Jesus to live a new life, dressed in clothing fit for a king. When God looks at us, he doesn't see our sin, he sees Jesus! God doesn't see a mess, he sees people he loves; people for whom he has prepared an eternal home.

President's report

I met with Mary Kaschner on April 30th regarding the Howard Kaschner Estate, and picked up the final distributions from the estate trust. We are receiving \$15,729.90 in one check and \$114.26 from a second check that the estate received from Thrivent matching fund that she is giving to the church. I need to discuss the distribution of these funds with Randy Matter as we had issues with the last distribution and I want to make sure this does not happen again. These funds are being distributed as follows: \$3961.04 to the Restricted Building Fund, \$3961.04 to the Cemetery Fund, \$3168.82 to the WELS

Church Extension Fund, \$1584.42 to WELS Home Missions, \$1584.42 to WELS World Missions, and \$1584.42 to Wisconsin Lutheran Institutional Ministries.

There has been some questions regarding the third secretary and how we should utilize that position both for the very near future during the construction phase and also long-term. I have had e-mail conversations with Tim & Pastor Loescher. My take on it would be that we should have this position end at the end of this school year and going forward start the process of volunteers to answer the phone when not covered by our existing secretaries. We need to see if there is a volunteer that would undertake the "Shepherd's Staff" software input and upkeep. This is an important piece of software that is underutilized and needs to be maintained. Council discussed this information. There was a concern noted about keeping the attendance and visitor information updated on a timely basis. Dan was aware of a potential volunteer for some of the software maintenance. Dave Nunez, Dennis Bell, and Tim Gustafson will meet to evaluate the distribution of the secretarial work.

I am in the process of working on "cleaning up" the responsibilities, functions, and overall workings of the Technology Committee. I feel there is too much of a disconnect as to who is working on what. Not that anyone is doing anything wrong, I would just like to make sure that once we are at the point of moving computers, ordering and running computer lines, moving office equipment into place, I want a clear and defined plan. In order to do this, I think a "re-look" at this committee is appropriate and I will be putting together an outline defining this and sending it out later this week. I would like to have everyone take a look at this document and reply your comments to everyone accordingly.

Treasurer's report

The April 30, 2009 ending balance in our operating fund shows a deficit of \$176,696 compared to a deficit of \$169,610 March 31, 2009 and a deficit of \$138,602 on April 30, 2008. Year to date operating fund receipts are \$268,021 compared to \$269,334 last year and this year's budget of \$280,580. Our Foundation Build on the Rock funding appeal has received year to date revenues of \$132,761.

New Business

Request for burial rights in David's Star Cemetery A son of our congregation who was a called worker, and is a current Missouri Synod member, requested burial rights on our cemetery. Council denied this request as this does not fall under current cemetery guidelines.

Building Committee recommendation – Having reviewed the latest cost estimates for the construction of the building project as approved at the special February 11, 2009 voter's meeting and reviewing the directly related other than construction costs, the cost of borrowing money at the current time, and the fact that we have raised in excess of \$150,000 of the cash into the master plan, construction documents and fund raising costs to date, and being blessed with commitments in excess of \$658, 000 in pledges and an additional \$20,000 per year in Thrivent pledges (\$718,000 total = pledges + Thrivent), we recommend to allow for borrowing of the funds necessary to complete the connector building, heating, ventilating and cooling updates for the school, and heating updates for the church, septic system updated as needed and for the remodeling of the school. In addition, considering the need for mechanical room space and the increased expenses that would result if the narthex is built at a future date due to portions that would be abandoned or reworked, we recommend to construct the full narthex at this time. We believe that this construction will greatly enhance our fellowship opportunities and ultimately aid in the spread of the Gospel.

The construction work is to begin on June 1, 2009 with CD Smith as the CM (Construction Management firm). The school remodeling is to be completed by September 2009 and the completion of the balance of the

construction by Christmas, 2009. The estimated cost totals \$2,700,000 for direct construction costs, \$475,000 for directly related other than construction costs and allowing \$125,000 for contingency costs for a total dollar amount of \$3,300,000. We find that it is prudent to amend the fund raising restrictions of 1/3 cash, 1/3 pledges and 1/3 long-term borrowing to 57% cash and pledges with 43% in long-term loans.

We further recommend that the following items are to be added to the current construction project if donors are moved to directly support these items in addition to any current pledges, in a timely manner

1. Canopy drop off at the south entrance (\$20,000)
2. Air conditioning for the church (\$6,000)
3. Finish roughed-in concession area (\$7,500)
4. Walk off mats at three entrances (\$7,500)
5. Blinds for the windows (up to \$20,000)
6. Larger elevator capable of handling a casket (\$4,800)
7. Upgrade restrooms to solid Phenolic partitions (\$4,800)

For clarification, the following items have been removed from the project as it is currently proposed:

1. Fire suppression system. The fire suppression system will be added when the sanctuary is built.
2. Stone on the exterior of the narthex that would be lost when the sanctuary is built has been replaced with brick.

The above recommendation was discussed by Council, and approved to be brought to the voters at the quarterly meeting.

Financing Committee recommendation – The financing subcommittee of the building committee would like to proceed with securing financing for the first phase of the building project with Port Washington State Bank based on the proposal submitted by Gary Heckendorf April 10, 2009. Details of the proposal include a 5.25 percent rate without a deposit relationship (5.125 percent with a deposit relationship), a five year term with the first year being interest only followed by four years of principal and interest, a 20 year amortization after the first year, standard out-of-pocket expenses plus \$500, collateral being first mortgage on the David's Star properties and assignment of pledges, no prepayment penalty, and the first year being the construction period and all draws will be handled through the title company. This recommendation was approved by council to be presented to the voters at the next voter's meeting.

Storage shed recommendation – The Buildings and Ground Committee and the Cemetery Committee recommend to Council that we have the metal storage shed removed to allow for more parking in the new construction. This will allow for better drainage and cleaner sightlines in and around the new parking areas and south entrance into the school. If the old shed is left in place, it will be

approximately 3'-4' above the parking lot grade, have to be ramped in order for the lawn mowers to be stored and cause issues with drainage from the parking lot.

Last week the Synodical Council released additional details about the proposed synodical budget that will be considered by the synod convention this summer. With expected financial resources approximately \$8 million less than needed, all areas of ministry are preparing to make significant cuts in their staffing and programs. Because of the extent and urgency of the budget reductions, some ministry positions are being eliminated immediately – you may be hearing about them from various sources. Waiting longer to begin those reductions would mean additional cuts later on.

The proposed budget includes two options. Option A calls for significant reductions in all areas of ministry but would enable the synod to maintain its two ministerial education prep schools. Option B would shift funds from Ministerial Education and provide \$500,000 each to Home and World Missions; this shift would result in fewer reductions in mission programs at home and in various mission fields around the world. According to the Board for Ministerial Education, Option B would make it possible to operate only one synodical prep school after the coming year.

The Synodical Council chose to present two options because it recognized that there are clear differences of opinion on how best to allocate the synod's limited resources. Rather than choosing one of those options are recommending it, the Synodical Council determined that it could best serve the synod if it presented two clear choices and enabled the delegates at the convention to make an informed, prayerful decision.

IDD – “JUST DO IT”

How many of you are filled with abbreviations in your daily life? In computer talk we have RAM, HTML, KB, MB, GB, etc. In psychological talk there is OCD, ADD, ASD, etc. Even with Bible translations there is KJV, NIV, NIrV, etc.

I read recently about a new one labeled IDD and it stands for Integrity Deficit Disorder. The article by Otis Young puts it this way; “A person who is affected with this disorder knows what’s right but doesn’t follow through and do what’s right. He or she makes a promise or commitment and then fails to keep it.”

IDD people make excuses for why they didn’t do what they said they were going to do. IDD is not a mental illness. It is a choice, sometimes a sinful choice. God’s Word tells us: *Anyone, then, who knows the good he ought to do and doesn’t do it, sins.* (James 4:17)

The number one reason for not having a will or creating an estate plan is procrastination. “I’ll get to it next month.” Our attitude should be just like the Nike commercials, “Just Do It!” By planning your financial legacy now you are responding to God’s grace in Christ.
