**Teen Traffic Fatalities**

In the last couple of months several families in our Synod have experienced a teenage traffic fatality. We lost one student from WISCO in a car accident and two college age students from New Ulm tragically died in another car accident. We pray that God continues to comfort those families as they mourn their loss. As parents and grandparents of many new and younger drivers I can't help but wonder if there may be a thing or two that we could learn or be reminded of as we teach our children.

AAA tells us that "YES!" there are a few suggestions that may help save our teens lives. Wisconsin has laws in place that limit the number of passengers a new teen driver may have in the car with them or the hours that they may be driving. You may feel that your teen is safer than others are, but the law is in place for all teens to obey so always monitor your teens driving and keep the ground rules firm. Keep your teen from eating or using the cell phone while driving (even the hands-free type). Even experienced drivers have trouble driving while talking on the phone. Make sure your teen uses their seatbelt each time they ride in the car. Though teens feel they are invincible, they certainly are not. Teens have the highest crash rates, but yet the lowest rates of seat belt usage.

The teens that cause accidents are practicing reckless behavior like driving while drunk or under the influence of drugs. Others are being just plain careless by not practicing safe driving conduct that they learned in drivers education classes. Ask any teenager who drives and acts responsibly why they have **not** been in an accident. More than likely, their answer will be that their parents will impose **consequences** for their negative actions and behavior. Cutting off a teens' source of independence is a wonderful motivator! Take away the car keys if you have to! Don't forget to lead by example! Safe driving practices are a good idea for all of us!

### WELS UPDATE FROM THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The synod's special Year of Jubilee celebration will be coming to an end this month at the synod convention in Saginaw, Michigan. Rev. Dave Liggett, director of WELS Ministry of Christian Giving, says it's not too late for congregations, that have not yet participated to get involved. So far, 62 percent of congregations have submitted offerings, giving more than \$3.6 million. The offering was authorized by the 2007 convention to eliminate or reduce the synod's \$22.4 million debt. Combined with regularly scheduled debt payments, the offerings have reduced the debt by \$15.1 million.

We continue to pray for the unassigned graduates of Martin Luther College and Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary. We are pleased that several unassigned candidates from both schools have recently been assigned and that several more assignments are in the process of being made.

WELS Women's Ministry Committee, part of the Commission on Adult Discipleship, has scheduled the second national WELS women's leadership conference for July 16-18, 2010. Under the theme "Leading with a Christ-like attitude" the conference will focus on Philippians 2:1-18. It will be held at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary.

## Faithful in all Things

### Specks, Logs, & Christian Preambles

The story goes that a young couple moved into a new neighborhood. The next morning while eating breakfast the young woman saw her neighbor hanging her wash outside. “That laundry is not very clean,” she said. “She doesn’t know how to wash correctly. Maybe she needs better laundry soap.” The husband looked on but remained silent. Each time the neighbor would hang her wash out to dry the young woman would make the same comments. About a month later, the woman was surprised to see a nice clean wash on the line and said to her husband: “Look, she has learned how to wash correctly. I wonder who taught her this.” The husband replied, “I got up early this morning and cleaned our windows.”

Is it time for you to clean your windows to see the need for Christian estate planning? Your earthly estate is a trust from God. God is the owner of your estate. He gives you the responsible position of managing it in life and in death. Through Christian estate planning you have the privilege and joy of expressing your love for him and for others. How do you start?

Start with a Christian preamble that can be read and shared by others at the time of your death. Here is just one example:

*I, (your name here) do hereby testify that I am a Christian. I have placed all my hope of life hereafter in Jesus Christ, the Son of God. His death and resurrection have given my life meaning and make my death a peaceful passage to eternal life in heaven. I want my family and friends to know that for me to live was Christ, and to die is gain.*

It’s time to clean your windows. Confess what you believe, that our death may be a time of comfort, strength, and guidance to your family and friends.

*Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise – the fruit of the lips that confess his name.* Hebrews 13:15

Jesus said, “Whoever can be trusted with very little can be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much” (Luke 16:10). Jesus is saying that a faithful person will handle God’s gifts faithfully regardless of whether they have few or many gifts entrusted to them. What we do with what we have shows our faithfulness.

A faithful person will do the small things well. One day a young man went to a bank to apply for a job. After his interview, he was leaving the bank and happened to notice some small trash on the floor. He picked it up and put it in the waste paper basket. Seconds later, he helped an elderly lady with the door. Unknown to the young man, the man who had interviewed him for the job was observing him. The young man was promptly summoned back and given the job. The employer’s comment: “Anyone who pays attention to the small things as you just did needs to work here.”

Unfortunately, we Christians may incorrectly think that small things aren’t important to God. We may have the attitude that God won’t be concerned with the small amount of money or other gifts that we have been given. In the Bible, God spoke mightily through the little that people had. God used the widow and her two mites to teach us a lesson about sacrificial giving. He used the small amount of flour and oil that the Widow of Zarephath had to demonstrate obedience. Jesus used the loaves and fish of a young boy to reveal how God can magnify a small gift. God commended their faith with small things, and He didn’t overlook what faithful people did with small things.

Through God’s Word, we understand that small things do count. Because we understand our need to be faithful with all things, we should ask ourselves how we are handling the seemingly small things in our lives. Are we handling small things well in our homes, jobs, and churches? Can non-Christians see a difference in us? With God’s help, we can be faithful with **ALL** that we’ve been given. Through our faithfulness, God will be glorified.
